OCLC WorldCat Collection Analysis Tool

Milton has been talking to OCLC and thinks that we may be able to get a substantial discount if we agree to do case studies on the product. We would work with OCLC to design the case studies and could veto anything we don't want published. This could be an excellent opportunity to publish articles. All agreed that Milton should proceed with the negotiations. He is primarily addressing the consortial pricing but will work on getting discounts on individual pricing as well

Elsevier

John met with Barbara Kaplan and Michael Schluter who presented a proposal for backfiles and discussed SCOPUS.

- **Backfiles**- After the conference call John sent out via email the back file proposal which includes pricing for single institutions by size of institution. Discounts are offered for the purchase of 2-5 collections (25%) and all collections (35%). John thinks there would be a larger discount for a consortial purchase. This is a one time purchase with no annual fees. Discounts will be given for previously purchased collections. Monica brought up the problem of titles which we purchase and which subsequently are sold to another publisher. This is a big topic and needs to be clarified if we move forward with this purchase. CRL has received a Mellon grant to review and audit the archives and practices of three online journal publishers (Elsevier, Ithaca ? and PubMed Central).
- **SCOPUS**- Monica and John attended the SCOPUS presentation at ICOLC. SCOPUS is an indexing agent providing search results from Elsevier and other titles within an institution. It covers 14,000 titles in all areas except humanities and is being compared to Web of Science. Elsevier's 'roll out program' pricing, good through the end of August, offers a 3 year subscription for the cost of one year. Elsevier can provide a trial so that we can evaluate SCOPUS and determine whether we would be able to cancel any other indexes if we subscribe. Elsevier will send John pricing and a copy of the license agreement. The CMC voted to trial this product but will ask the ECC to handle the trial and evaluation.
- **Unsubscribed Elsevier titles**- Elsevier is extending our access to all titles until Sept. 15th to allow us more time to swap out subscriptions. John will organize the swapping of titles.
- **Book series**- Elsevier will be sending John a proposal for their new Book Series.

ICOLC- John will send out his notes on the meeting; he asks that we not forward these notes to anyone else. Minutes from the ICOLC meeting will also be sent to the group. Topics of interest at the ICOLC meeting included: Google Print, Google Scholar, APA and CRL Digital Delivery.
