

## PSPC Access Services Subcommittee Conference Call 12/2/2011

UWF took minutes.

1. Minutes approved with the correction of Jenny Diamond's full name and institutional affiliation, which is FIU.
2. Resource Sharing Task Force – Kristine Shrauger
  - a. Kristine shared a power point presentation which outlines the dilemma of continuing with the current 30 day periods for UBorrow and local practices for ILL, or moving to a 60 day loan period for both UBorrow and ILL.
  - b. The longer loan period would help with renewal requests and overdues, and seems fairer to graduate students who need adequate time to accomplish their research.
  - c. Shipping and receiving reduces the actual time patrons are able to use books.
  - d. UWF and UF have concerns about the 60 day loan period, however, most others are enthusiastic about it. Kristine will research this further and discuss the issue in more depth with UWF and UF.
3. FCLA Update – Jennifer Kuntz
  - Jennifer asks for our understanding as FCLA enters a period of uncertainty. FCLA is being asked to focus on the Single Bib project, which is targeted to go into production in June 2012. Other projects will be maintained but will have a lower priority.
  - FCLA reported to CSUL that UBorrow clicks reached 23,879 in November
  - FCLA is working on improvements to UBorrow that will optimize services and streamline workflows (e.g., auto renewal, auto recall local request buttons, and adding pick up locations.) Other enhancements will be delayed because of the Single Bib effort.
  - FCLA will focus on maintaining UBorrow and developing documentation.
  - All 11 SULs will be migrating to a single bib architecture. A description of the project is on the FCLA webpage under the Acq/Cat/Circ heading.
  - Currently three institutions (FSU, UF, and USF) are testing Single Bib and the rest of the SULs will join the test in January 2012. From January through June, we will all be conducting testing and undergoing training.
  - Single bib access will allow all institutions to see each other's titles but we will be limited to working with our own holdings. FCLA is still working on Reserves and UBorrow in the new architecture. Jennifer sees potential to be able to enhance distance delivery in UBorrow through the new system but it will not be ready by June.
  - Our deans will be requesting a point person at each institution for the single bib project
