Subcommittee update:

- Florida NACO funnel: Priscilla is encouraging Sarah Norris, visiting librarian at New College to join the Florida NACO Funnel. Sarah had asked if she could just send headings to Priscilla. Library of Congress suggested membership.

FCLA update (Mary Ann O'Daniel):

- The library-specific ARROW authority reports are not returning results for last week's LCA10 loads (1125). They are looking into the problem.
- FCLA organizational structure: Future of the Libraries Task Force report is due Jan. 1, 2012 will define a new organizational structure and reporting lines for the joint FCLA/CCLA organization mandated by the state legislature. A hired consultant is assisting the different working groups to keep them on track.
- UBBorrow full launch date is August 1, 2011.
- FCLA is working on the new CSUL website. It is built through Drupal – a content management system. They are transferring information from the old site hosted

by FSU to the new. It should be in production in the next couple weeks. They will be looking for 1 or 2 liaisons to make updates. Lisa Tatum will be the trainer. Can decide if you want things moved over from the Swiki. It should be easier for finding things and keeping up to date.

- Aleph test version 20 is being reviewed now by FCLA. It will be turned over to us next week. We will have two weeks to look over. Aleph version 19 will be taken down on Friday, July 22. The upgrade to Aleph production version 20 will take place the weekend of July 23-24. CCLA is already on version 20. FCLA will do Elluminate Live sessions on August 15 and 19. They will do site visits in the fall.

#### New Business

- Point of cataloging authority control. Most of the schools are already doing. There were some questions if the Acquisitions Departments at several schools are following this practice. At some later point, the Metadata Subcommittee might be asked to put into the general guidelines for best practices.
- VIAF (Virtual International Authority File). Elaine demonstrated the site. Priscilla and Ruth use for NACO heading research. Elaine also uses with the delete headings for research for the proper heading and also for differentiating headings. Related to this, we looked at a German bibliographic record that shows how they are already coding access point URIs.
- Discussion of ALA sessions attended on the Semantic Web, URIs and linking data. Elaine talked about the MST Toolkit (Metadata Service Toolkit) part of the eXtensible Catalog Project.
- Priscilla gave updates from the PCC Trainer's meeting. See link for LC's RDA timeline and details: <http://www.loc.gov/bibliographic-future/rda/> The Coordinating Committee recommends that RDA should be implemented by LC, NAL, and NLM no sooner than January 2013. There are three task forces that are looking at creating training documents for copy catalogers and authorities.
