Within the first year of access to a CSUL Shared Storage Facility, approximately 20,000-25,000 sq. ft. of current space in the Tampa Library building could be reallocated. A significant reduction in our GPO profile/collection of print documents would also be a cost savings in staff processing time (at least 2 FTE), subscription costs for purchase of Marcive tapes and technical support for periodic loading, and elimination of redundancy in documents delivered in both electronic & print formats.

***The USF Tampa Library is extremely interested in participating in shared collections within a proposed CSUL Storage Facility (e.g. retaining one or two copies of particular bound journal volumes or federal documents as permanent statewide print collection; discarding all others). In addition, we are very interested in some designated space for storage and preservation of collections unique to USF.***
